# **RELEASE SCHEDULE**

# WILD CARD CONTEST

When the number of automatic team entries exceeds the number of openings in the draw, the Commissioner may order a special playoff contest (Wild Card System) to determine the main draw for the playoffs. The designation of the "host" team for a Wild Card contest will have no bearing on the location of a team's next contest when such a procedure is used.

# **CIFSS HOME REQUIREMENTS**

#### SCHEDULES & SCORES

Complete your schedule in CIFSSHome prior to your season as well as update scores following each contest.

Athletic Directors/Coaches: It is very important that you enter your entire season schedule into CIFSSHome (<u>www.cifsshome.org</u>) as well as update the scores immediately following your contests.

Log in @ <u>www.cifsshome.org</u> (If you do not have a log in & password as a coach, check with your Athletic Director). Once you are logged in: -On the left panel, click on "Teams", select "Softball"

-To Add a game, click "Add Game" at the top right and fill out all of the required fields which are marked by a red (\*) to complete your schedule. -To Submit your score, click on the "Teams", select "Softball". Scroll through your schedule and click on the green "Post Result" button.

-Make sure that your overall and team records are correct on your team page.

#### VARSITY TEAM INFORMATION

COMPLETE ROSTER DUE no later than WEDNESDAY, JUNE 2, 2020.

Athletic Directors/Coaches: It is very important that you enter your entire Softball Varsity roster into CIFSSHome (<u>www.cifsshome.org</u>) no later than WEDNESDAY, APRIL 29, 2020.

Log in @ www.cifsshome.org (If you do not have a log in & password as a coach, check with your Athletic Director).

Once you are logged in:

-On the left panel, Click on the "Teams" tab, select "Softball"

-Here are the instructions for using the sample file.

- Download the sample file <u>and</u> delete the "contents only". Copy and paste or type your roster information into the file as the contents and save the file to your computer. You can only upload an excel file (xls) that is the exact same format as the sample file. Columns for information not required for your sport may be left blank, but the HEADER INFORMATION MUST REMAIN EXACTLY AS THE SAMPLE.

#### Required Columns for Softball are: First Name, Last Name, Birth date, Year, Number, Position & Eligibility.

- Next - click Choose File, find your file, then click "Import Student".

- To confirm your roster has been uploaded, your roster will be uploaded in the roster section and all of the required columns are filled out.

#### VARSITY COACHES

#### AT-LARGE APPLICATION - MUST HAVE .500 RECORD OR BETTER

Athletic Directors/ Coaches: Please follow the instructions below to enter your school as an At Large Entry for Softball. The At Large Application is to be submitted by your school no later than THURSDAY, MAY 27, 2021 @ 11:00 p.m.

Log in @ www.cifsshome.org (If you do not have a log in & password as a coach, check with your Athletic Director).

Once you are logged in:

-On the left panel, click on At-Large Petition

-Select "Softball" then click "Add"

Please be sure that your Schedule is updated in CIFSSHome as this is where the information for the At-Large Petition will be created.

At-Large teams must have a .500 record or better for their complete schedule to be considered. A tie will count as a  $\frac{1}{2}$  win and a  $\frac{1}{2}$  loss as the criteria for a .500 or better record. (A record of 10-10-1 would be considered as qualifying.

#### At-Large Selection:

If the material is not submitted, the team will not be placed under consideration in that the At-Large selection committee will have no statistical data from which to draw. See page 12 for more information regarding At-Large selection.

### Mandatory Playoff Use Requirement:

The mandatory "official" ball rule for all playoff rounds, excluding golf. The rule applies throughout the conduct of <u>all CIF-SS playoff</u> contests.

## Playoff Ball Use Rule Enforcement:

Should a school fail to provide the correct game ball, the game will always be played. Teams/schools failing to utilize the correct official ball in CIF-SS playoffs will be reported by officials to CIF-SS and will not be allowed to host their next available home playoff game. Penalty will carry over to the next season if not enforceable this season due to elimination.

Note: <u>NFHS</u> stamp is required in all sports except in golf and tennis.

# COIN FLIPS

The coin flips, where necessary, are conducted under the direction of the Commissioner at **9:00 A.M.** the day following the first contest in the lobby of the CIF Southern Office. **Pre-flips will be available on the web at <u>www.cifss.org</u> under the Softball sports page after the first round. # PLAYOFF ENTRY AND FORMAT

The 2020-2021 Softball Playoff brackets will be established based on submissions from the respective league within each division. There will be seven divisions of Softball. All recognized leagues will be guaranteed entries based on the size of the league. All 4 team leagues will be guaranteed 2 entries; 5 and 6 team leagues will be guaranteed 3 entries; 7 and 8 team leagues will be guaranteed 4 entries; 9 or more team leagues will be guaranteed 5 entries. Under the playoff format, in all sports, leagues have the responsibility of developing and identifying the priority for their representatives into the playoffs as so noted under Article 330 (Playoffs) of the CIF Southern Section Blue Book. Please note, leagues may not conduct additional contests beyond the prescribed limits unless said contests are to determine ENTRY and not representative priority (leagues must have this as part of their constitution and must secure permission from the CIF-SS office before conducting such playoffs for entry).

# LEAGUE CHANGE OF ENTRY

Once the draw sheet has been finalized by the CIF Southern Section Office and then notification is received that a league has made a mistake in submitting the proper entries in order of priority, this Office may exchange positions of the schools involved in the bracket from that league. Once the playoffs begin no changes due to incorrect information can be accepted and adjusted.

# END OF COMPETITION

All league competition for entries must end on Thursday, May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Schools may compete until Saturday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, 2021 in non-league contests. Any contest(s) played after the completion of league play and/or submission of league entries will not impact the entries (final record), seeding or ranking of a team or teams that were involved in those events.

# **BRACKET CONSTRUCTION**

SEEDS - The initial step is to designate four teams in rank order as seeds, with No. 1, 2, 3, and 4 placed in the designated draw position in each quarter of the bracket. Now, designate the next four teams in rank order as seeds, with No. 5, 6, 7, and 8 being placed in each quarter of the designated bracket. Next, the teams designated as seeds No. 9, 10, 11, and 12 will be placed in each quarter of the designated bracket. The last four teams in rank order designated as No. 13, 14, 15, and 16 will now be placed in each quarter of the designated bracket.

# ADJUSTMENTS

Adjustments to this procedure would be made if the seeds in the same half/quarter of the bracket were from the same league. If this occurs, using the example of the top half of the bracket, should the No. 1 and 4 seeds be from the same league, No. 4 would become the No. 3 seed and the No. 3 seed would fill the No. 4 designated position.

Adjustment may become necessary to ensure that the No. 1 and 2 entries from the same league are placed in opposite halves of the overall bracket.

Note: Throughout this process, a league No. 2 entry may not be seeded higher than the No. 1 entry from the same league, nor may a No. 3 league entry be seeded higher than the No. 2 entry from the same league. If there are First Round "byes" available in playoff brackets, those byes will be awarded to League Champions first, regardless of the overall seeding for that particular bracket. If all the League Champions in that particular bracket have been awarded a "bye", and there are still additional byes available, 2nd place teams will have priority to receive them.

# FILLING THE DRAW

The next step is to begin completing the draw by placing any remaining No. 2 league entries in the opposite half of the bracket from the No. 1 entries from the same league. The final step to complete the draw is to place the remaining No. 3 entries (along with any No. 4 entries, At-Large and/or Freelance teams) from each of the respective leagues in the remaining open slots, attempting to place each in one of the remaining "quarters" of the bracket where the league is not represented. This process eliminates the aspect of schools from the same league meeting in the second round of competition (Exception: if the overall bracket holds less than 32 teams, it is possible for two teams from the same league to meet in the second round or if five (5) or more entries from the same league compete in the same division two teams from the same league will be placed in the same quarter).

# WILD CARD CONTEST

Where the number of teams exceeds the number of openings in the draw, the Commissioner may order a special playoff contest (Wild-Card System) to determine entry into the main draw for the playoffs. Wild Card contest are only necessary and allowable when the number of automatic entries for the bracket exceeds the size of the bracket. For example, 37 teams earned an automatic entry into a 32 team bracket. Wild Card contests become necessary to trim the field down to 32 teams.

# AT-LARGE ENTRIES

AT-LARGE entries can only be considered when the number of automatic entries does not fill the size of the playoff bracket. For example, 30 teams earned an automatic entry therefore two (2) AT-LARGE entries are to be selected to fill the bracket to 32 teams.

The Coaches Advisory Committee will make selections based upon the following:

- (a) Head-to-head competition of teams under consideration
- (b) Strength of schedule and results vs. teams in division and higher
- (c) Overall strength of the league from which the team is entered
- (d) Overall win-loss record
- (e) Strength against common opponents

# **BYLAW 330 PLAYOFFS**

# **PLAYOFF HOSTING INFORMATION**

# DETERMINATION OF SITES FOR ALL PLAYOFF ROUNDS AND FINALS

To decide who shall be the host team **AFTER** the first round of competition will be the sole responsibility of the Commissioner. In cases where two teams are paired after the first round of the playoffs, the team having the fewest number of host games in playoff competition shall be designated as the host team. When both teams have had an equal number of host playoff contests, the Commissioner shall toss a coin to decide the host team. When a school has been designated as the host school for a playoff contest it shall (1) act in that capacity unless excused by the Commissioner, and (2) be considered the host team regardless of where the game is being played. **SPECIAL NOTE:** *Teams receiving a bye in the first round shall automatically be the host team in the next round of the playoffs.* 

The designation of "host" does not guarantee the game will be played at the host school's facility. It does designate the responsibility for management of the contest which includes suggesting a site that will handle the anticipated crowd. A host school may use its home site facility if it can safely provide for the anticipated crowd.

The host school is charged with the responsibility of securing an adequate facility for the holding of a Softball playoff contest. It is recommended that where available and when approved, playoff games shall be played in rent-free high school facilities, but in cases where it is necessary to pay a rental fee for an outside facility; such an arrangement must be approved by the Commissioner prior to the contest.

Competing schools are reminded that CIF Southern Section playoff softball games, while they may be played at one school, are under the control of the CIF-SS. Both competing schools in any one game are given equal consideration regarding seating. If, in the Commissioner's opinion, the host team field is not large enough to accommodate the anticipated crowd, the host team will be required to reserve one-half of the facility's capacity for the visiting school's rooters.

# PRE-GAME ARRANGEMENTS

A. The host school is responsible for:

- Securing a site which meets the standards as outlined in the National Federation Softball Rule Book. (Rule 1, Section 1 & 2). Fields do NOT need to have an outfield fence but the "ground rules" should address balls that are hit through the outfield beyond the field of play.
- 2) Fields with baseball pitching mounds may not be used for any playoff contest.
- Schools not playing on their high school campus must inform the CIF-SS Office of the location of their host site. Do not secure a site which requires a time deadline.
- 4) Typing the ground rules on a card with copies to both umpires and the

opposing coach prior to the game.

- 5) Contacting the visitors prior to game day to establish any necessary ground rules should the field or equipment not meet required National Federation standards. (See Rule 1, Section 1 & 2)
- 6) Providing information to the visitors regarding directions to the school, locker room arrangements, visitor parking, or any other special circumstances relative to the contest.
- 7) To prevent game delays it is recommended that the home team have available a minimum of five game balls for each game.
- Game Ball <u>The home team provides</u> the game balls per National Federation Rules. The Dudley CFP-12Y NFHS will be the game ball for ALL PLAYOFF ROUNDS & CHAMPIONSHIPS.
- 9) **Infield/Outfield Practice.** For the Playoffs, each team is allowed a 10minute pre-game infield and/or outfield warm-up on the playing field prior to the start of the contest.
- B. The CIF-SS office is not presently equipped to survey all sites during the coming post-season competition, and although it is necessary that one team be designated the HOST team, it shall be kept in mind that the game belongs equally to both competing schools. Therefore, it is recommended that a pre-game planning meeting be held to cover all details (field conditions, crowd control, supervision) connected with the staging of every playoff contest.
- C. During playoffs, teams competing in the playoffs are not allowed to workout or practice at the site of Southern Section Softball Championships that will be played at Deanna Manning Stadium at Colonel Bill Barber Marine Corps Memorial Park (1 Civic Center Drive, Irvine).

# GAME TIMES

All games are scheduled for **3:15 p.m.** When schools must travel extensive distances for a playoff game, it is recommended that the teams mutually agree to a later start time. A school may play at other times or on other days if it is mutually agreeable to both competing schools.

Any changes must be confirmed between your opponent <u>prior to contacting</u> our office or the match officials/local assignor. Any game time, location change, or date change must be sent via e-mail to the CIF-SS office.

The e-mail must include the following information:

- Teams in the Contest
- New game time / location / date
- The statement "I have confirmed this change with the Athletic Director, (insert name)"
- The visiting school's Athletic Director has been included in the e-mail

# ADMISSION REGULATIONS

Due to the inability of several schools to secure a playing site which is enclosed, there will be no admission charge at the playoff contests. The exception to this rule will be the championship games at Deanna Manning Stadium or a designated "home" site for a championship final.

However, if two competing schools agree, and admission is charged, the following financial regulations will be in effect:

- A. Admission Prices: The admission prices shall be \$4.00 for adults, \$3.00 for students from the competing schools and \$3.00 for children under 12. (Schools may agree to a lower price structure).
- B. Host School: The designated host school is responsible for all costs incurred in hosting the contest. These would include officials, supervision, stadium rental, etc.
- C. Visiting School: The designated visiting school is responsible for all costs incurred in traveling, such as bus, meals, etc.
- D. Gate Split: When admission is charged, the gate is to be handled as a gross gate and split 50-50 between the competing schools (please refer to Article 1, Rule #144 of the Blue Book).

# PLAYOFF REQUIREMENTS – ALL TEAMS/HOST SITES

# SQUAD SIZE

**Up to 25 person maximum is allowed in the dugout;** however, the CIF-SS will only provide <u>awards up to 20 per team</u>. There is a seat limit at the Championship Finals and all overflow players/coaches/trainer/stats personal will be seated behind the team bench area.

# ELIGIBILITY LISTS

The eligibility list is your updated and complete roster which is submitted to CIFSSHome.org <u>PRIOR</u> to your first playoff contest and will suffice for all remaining softball playoff contests. **Please update by May 29, 2021.** 

# GAMES OFFICIALS

Officials for all playoff matches will be coordinated through the CIF-SS. Schools will be notified well in advance of the names of officials assigned to their games. Out of area Officials will be assigned starting in the Semi-Final round. In all matches leading to the championship finals, the <u>Plate Umpire shall receive \$79 and Base Umpire \$79</u>.

When officials travel significant distances to officiate a playoff game, meals and mileage **<u>may</u>** also be authorized.

# SCORE KEEPER

A qualified, experienced scorekeeper shall be provided by the host team. It is recommended that scorekeepers from both teams sit together for the duration of the game.

# ANNOUNCER

The announcer should be a responsible adult who can set the tone of the game by calling the fans' attention to the following points of reference.

# (Please read prior to start of each contest)

(1) CIF Southern Section Playoff contests are conducted under the strictest code of good sportsmanship. (2) The officials are neutral people, representing the Commissioner, and have been selected because of demonstrated ability. (3) Fans are encouraged to support their own team and are requested to display proper sportsmanship with respect to the visiting school and the officials. (4) Spectators are asked not to use flash photography. The CIF-Southern Section appreciates your attendance and support of high school volleyball.

# **CHEERING SECTION**

Fan/Student cheering sections are encouraged to cheer and support their own team and should display proper sportsmanship with respect to the opposing team and the game

officials. They are expected to follow the following guidelines and failure to do so may lead to removal from the contest and or/forfeiture of the contest.

1. Noisemakers (the use of artificial noisemakers, ball buckets, air horns, horns, cow bells, bells, victory bells, sirens, chimes, wooden blocks, thunder sticks, etc. and electronic amplifiers) by student-athletes and team personal is prohibited while on site for competition. For this rule, the field, bullpens and dugouts are considered "on site". Megaphones may only be used by the school's uniformed cheer squads.

2. Cheering devices such as rally towels, pom poms and pennants are acceptable when used within the bounds of good sportsmanship.

3. Face painting is acceptable from the neck up only and shall not include any inappropriate letters or symbols. Assigned school staff shall monitor their cheering sections regarding face painting.

4. It is the expectation that cheering section behavior will be monitored by the assigned staff of the school that they represent. All improper behavior/language should be addressed and corrected immediately by school staff supervisors.

5. Rules are subject to specific event and/or venue limitations. No standing or jumping on the team benches in the dugout. Please do not drag bats against the fencing in the dugout. In addition, any artificial noise that the umpire deems interferers with the contest must be terminated.

# PROTESTS

BY ACTION OF THE CIF-SS COUNCIL, PROTESTS OF PLAYOFF CONTESTS INVOLVING NATIONAL FEDERATION RULES WILL NO LONGER BE ENTERTAINED FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSION OF THE CONTEST.

Coaches may direct questions to the game officials as they pertain to a possible misapplication of the rules in accordance with the National Federation rules governing that sport. No protest may be carried forth once the contest is completed.

Coaches are encouraged to carry National Federation rule books with them for all playoff contests.

Schools will still have the opportunity to protest a contest in accordance with Southern Section rules, Bylaw 1111, as it pertains to use of ineligible player or violations of any CIF-Southern Section rule in accordance with the contest

# **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

1) In an instance where games cannot be started due to inclement weather, teams will postpone that day's scheduled game until the next available date. Weekday games will

be postponed until the next day, Saturday games will be postponed until the following Monday.

- If games are started and then must be called due to inclement weather, the following NFHS rules apply:
  - A) If a game has reached 4 and one-half completed innings, with the Home team ahead, then it is an official game and the result will stand. In other words, the Visiting team has had 5 completed innings at bat and the Home team is ahead in the contest.
  - B) If the game has reached 5 completed innings, with the Visiting team ahead, then it is an official game and the result will stand. In other words, if both teams have had 5 completed innings at bat and the Visiting team is ahead in the contest.
  - C) If a contest has not reached the required number of innings to be an official contest, and the game is called due to inclement weather, then the game is ended at that point. When the teams resume play on their next available date, the game starts over with no score. Also, no statistics from a game that ends before it is an official contest will be recorded.
  - D) If a contest has reached the required number of innings to be an official contest and is tied but must be suspended due to weather conditions or darkness interferes with play NFHS Rule 2-26-1 will be in effect.

Note: Lineup cards would remain the same from the point that the game was suspended.

3) We require that you please communicate with our office immediately on any changes to your scheduled games.

# **TOURNAMENT RULES**

- <u>RULES</u> (MERCY RULE) (10 run rule 2600.1) Games shall end after five innings of a seven-inning game when a team is behind by 10 runs (applicable to Wildcard, rounds 1 and 2 only). All playoff games after round 2 will be a minimum of <u>seven (7) innings</u>. All playoff games will be conducted under the 2020 National Federation Softball Rules, except where Blue Book rulings or this bulletin supersede.
- 2. <u>PRE-GAME BATTING PRACTICE</u> Includes bunting or slap hitting. Teams entered in the softball playoffs <u>WILL NOT</u> be permitted to take batting practice on the day of the scheduled contest. Batting practice is construed as any type of pitching motion with ANY type of ball from in front of the batter (including pitching machines, underhand tossing, overhand throwing or pepper).

# SIDE SOFT TOSS and BATTING TEES WILL BE ACCEPTABLE FOR PRE-GAME BATTING WARMUP.

The player who tosses the ball must not be standing; they must be sitting or on a knee <u>directly to the side</u> facing the batter. The ball should be lifted, not pitched, to the batter. <u>Coaches are responsible</u> for instructing and alerting all players of this rule. Coaches should also instruct players on the correct allowable position a person tossing ball should be in. At no time should the person tossing the ball be any place other than directly to the side of "plate" and directly facing the batter.

# THE PENALTY FOR BATTING PRACTICE WITH A WIFFLE BALL, SOFTBALL, BASEBALL, ETC. MAY BE FORFEITURE OF THE GAME.



A potential batting practice violation is not a violation under NFHS rules that can be protested. If the situation occurs the coach must bring the issue to the attention of the home plate umpire at the pre-game meeting and ask that it be recorded. The umpire will then forward that information in a report to our office after the game is over. The game is not played under protest.

## Question:

If a coach, during the home plate pre-game meeting, does not announce to the umpire and their opponent that a possible violation of the batting practice rule has occurred could that violation be considered at any time after?

## Answer:

No, any perceived batting practice violation must be noted by the plate umpire prior the end of the pregame meeting to be reported to the CIF-SS Office.

The only 'exceptions' are: Games broadcast via Bally's Sports West, Ball'ys SoCal, Prepzone or the NFHS Network.
- 'Official' Championship Souvenirs: The exclusive vendor for CIF Southern Section Championship souvenirs (t-shirts, scarfs, pins, beanies, hats, etc...) is our long-time partner CIF T-shirts. These are the official items sold each year per sport. You are likely familiar with their annual shirts at the finals. You can order team and individual items through them at www.ciftshirts.com.
- Official Ball Required: Only the approved official ball in each ball sport may be played by either school during CIF-SS playoff contests. This policy has been in effect since 2002.
- Gatorade Only: Only Gatorade jugs, cups, bottles, ice chests may be used or visible during any CIF-SS playoff contest. (No Powerade, Body Armor, etc). The only acceptable alternative is a plain-wrap or Igloo labeled products. This rule does not apply to the actual liquid distributed to athletes. This policy has been in effect since 1995.
- CIF-SS on Souvenirs: The 'CIF Southern Section', 'CIF-SS', 'Southern Section' and 'CIF' marks and logos are registered trademarks with the State of California. Schools may only use the CIF Southern Section marks on rings, patches and banners, by doing business with a CIF-SS licensed vendor. Schools may only use the CIF Southern Section marks on apparel and other souvenir items exclusively through ciftshirts.com. Schools creating items with CIF-SS registered marks from a non-licensed vendor will face sanction and/or will be required to purchase any unsold shirts/items at the Championship Final. A list of the currently licensed vendors for these products is included and regularly updated on www.cifss.org.

Refer to the Ticket Handlers and Financial Clerks memo included with your tickets for additional information.
CIF-SS/FORD Banner:	It is a requirement of each host school (including off-site) that the CIF-SS/Ford Championships banner be displayed at every playoff home game in football and the gymnasium sports post football season (or on the electronic signage where schools/ venues do not display banners). If you need a banner please contact jackieg@cifss.org
Gatorade:	It is a requirement of each school use only Gatorade product/jugs/cups/squeeze bottles during CIF-SS championship events. No other competitive product shall be used. Water can be placed in Gatorade merchandise.
PA Announcements:	As a host of a CIF-SS playoff contest, the CIF-SS announcements take precedence over the host school's messaging and must be read in entirety at each playoff contest. Home schools are the host of a CIF-SS event in the playoffs. For contractual requirements, please read all the provided PA's each contest.
Media Credential Acces	s: Accredited working media should be given admission to all playoff games by showing their CIF-SS Press or Photo credential.

# 2020-21 Volleyball Guidelines & Covid-19 Modifications

# Foundational Statement

The following guidelines and modifications were created to allow for the safe participation of student-athletes during the Covid-19 Pandemic. The following guidelines follow best practices and recommendations from the CIF, the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS), and will continue to remain within the scope of all state public health orders. The suggested NFHS modifications are recommendations only and not to be considered mandatory rule changes.

# MINIMAL

# **General Guidelines**

- Masks are recommended to be worn at all times by all individuals participating in the activity, even with heavy exertion as tolerated.
- Social distancing measures shall be in place at all times other than when engaged in competition.

# Event Limitations

- 28 matches permitted during the season.
- Adhere to local county guidelines.

# Pre-Game Conference

- Move the location of the pre-match conference to center court with one coach and one referee positioned on each side of the net. All four individuals maintain a social distance of 6-feet.
- Limit attendees to one coach from each team, first referee and second referee.
- Suspend the use of the coin toss to determine serve/receive. The visiting team will serve first in set 1 and alternate first serve for the remaining non-deciding sets.
- Suspend roster submission at the pre-match conference. Rosters are submitted directly to the officials' table before the 10-minute mark.

# Team Benches

- Suspend the protocol of teams switching benches between sets.
- Chairs shall not be permitted on the sideline except for coaching staff. Players shall stand while observing social distance requirements. Coaching staff may sit but must also honor social distance requirements.
- Spectators shall not be permitted behind team benches.

# Deciding Set Procedures

Move the location of the deciding set coin toss to center court with team captains and the second referee maintaining the appropriate social distance of 6-feet. A coin toss, called by the home team, will decide serve/receive.

# COVID-19 MODIFICATIONS

# Substitution Procedures

Maintain social distancing of 6 feet between the second referee and the player and substitute by encouraging substitutions to occur within the substitution zone closer to the attack line.

# Officials' Table

Limit to essential personnel which includes home team scorer, libero tracker and timer with a distance of 6-feet between individuals. Visiting team personnel (scorer, statisticians, etc.) are not deemed essential personnel and will need to find an alternative location.

# Pre/Post-Game Ceremony

Replace handshakes before and after the match with a social distance acknowledgment of the team's choosing.

# Volleyball Sanitation

Games shall utilize a three-ball rotation, ensuring that anytime a ball goes out of play it shall be sanitized thoroughly with a bleach wipe before returning to the rotation.

# Equipment & Accessories

- · Permissible face coverings are required to be worn at all times by all attendees present.
- Gloves are permissible.
- Players shall utilize their own equipment bin for all personal gear on the sideline.

# Uniform

- Long sleeves are encouraged to reduce skin contact with the ball.
- Long pants and undergarments are permissible.

# Water Bottles & Hydration Stations

- · Team members shall not share water bottles.
- Hydration stations may be utilized but shall be touched only by a single appointed monitor.

# Officials' Uniform & Equipment

- By local association adoption, long-sleeved, all-white/all-blue collared polo shirt/sweater are permissible.
- Electronic whistles shall be utilized to minimize the spread of respiratory particles.
- Permissible face coverings are required.
- Gloves are permissible.

# Regional Championships

- Qualifying teams reduced to eight (8) per division.
- All games played at host school sites.
- Championships shall be single elimination.
- Awards ceremonies will be limited to ensure safe social distancing and to minimize mass gatherings.

# Subject: CIF STATE SOFTBALL REGIONAL CRITERIA

The CIF Southern Section will be granted 20 entries into the CIF State Regional Championships. Teams may be moved to a different State Regional Division than the one in which they competed in during the Southern Section playoffs. There are no enrollment parameters in any division. The CIF State Seeding Committee has the authority to adjust when necessary due to travel considerations or when a repeat match-up of a final or semi-final occurs, but every effort is made to keep the schools in the order they are submitted. If one of the teams elects not to compete in the Regional event a school will be selected from the previous rounds. The highest seeded team that did not advance to the semi-final, or the final, will be invited followed by the next highest seeded team followed by the next, etc. until the entries are filled. The entrants will be as follows:

4 Semifinalists from Southern Section Division 1

4 Semifinalists from Southern Section Division 2

4 Semifinalists from Southern Section Division 3

2 Finalists from Southern Section Division 4

- 2 Finalists from Southern Section Division 5
- 2 Finalists from Southern Section Division 6
- 2 Finalists from Southern Section Division 7
